

The Neonatal Transfer Service

The ambulance that comes to collect your baby will be specially designed and equipped with the necessary specialist equipment to provide intensive care for sick newborn babies.

Your baby will be placed in an incubator to keep it warm, will have its heart rate, breathing and blood pressure monitored and may require equipment to help with breathing.

This will ensure a safe transfer to the unit that will care for your baby.

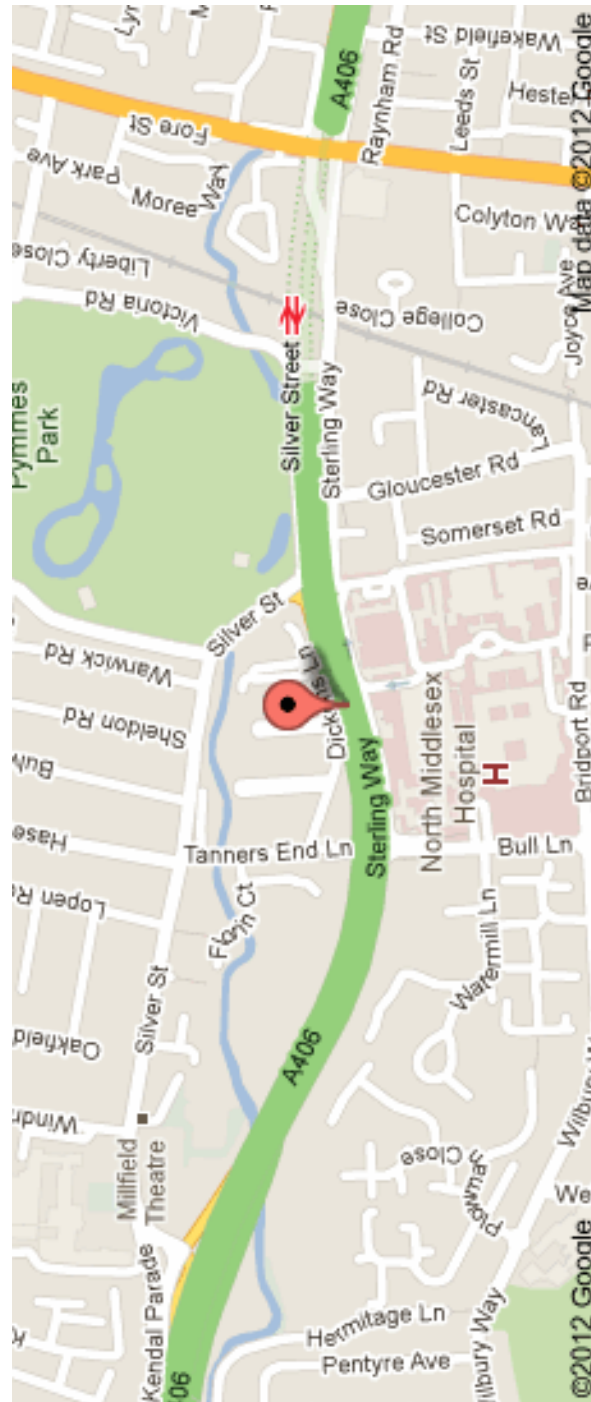
The transport team will all be specialists in the care of sick, newborn babies and will include a doctor or an advanced neonatal nurse practitioner, a senior neonatal nurse and a Paramedic. They will all have undertaken specialist transport training.

Information on about the Neonatal Unit and local Amenities

By road

Just Off The A406 (north Circular)

Nearest Coach Station: Victoria. Take Victoria line to Seven Sisters Station, then WAGN train to Silver Street Station. Turn right out of the station. Walk for five minutes and then you will arrive at the Maternity Unit .

Parking

Hospital car park: There is a dedicated car park for the Maternity Unit. This car park operates a pay & display policy.

By rail /underground

The nearest train station is Silver Street (WAGN Railway Company) and the hospital is approx 10 minute walk. Turn right out of the station. Walk for 5-10 minutes and will arrive at hospital entrance

The nearest tube station is Seven Sisters (Victoria Line) which connects to the WAGN main line which will allow you to disembark at Silver Street (3 stops).

You can travel from main line Liverpool Street station to Silver Street / or Liverpool Street underground links using Underground (Victoria Line) disembarking at Seven Sisters. If you are travelling from Enfield Town a main line will take you to Silver Street.

By bus

Buses – 144, 34, 102 and 444.
Bus routes 34, 102, and 144 stop at the junction of Fore Street and Angel Road, 444 stops in Gloucester Road close to the Hospital main entrance.

The 318 and 491 stop on the hospital site.

Visiting for siblings and others

Open visiting for parents, grandparents and siblings.

Other visitors may visit from 3 – 7.15pm with permission from parents. No children under 13 years except for siblings.

Facilities & Accommodation for parents

There is a parent's rest room, parent's kitchen with a microwave and refrigerator available. There are lockers available for parents to use (need to supply own padlock) and a quiet room if parents want to 'get away for a while'.

Bedrooms are available on the unit for Mum and Dad to room in prior to discharge but we are unable to accommodate siblings staying; there are no costs associated with this but the availability of these rooms is dependent upon need and cannot be guaranteed.

Mobile telephones may be used in the public areas but not in the nurseries or in the corridors immediately outside the nurseries.
